## Friends of the Library

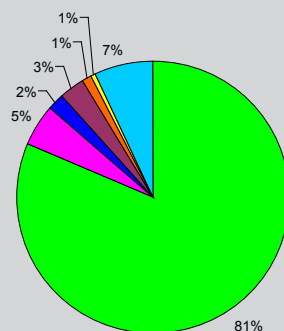
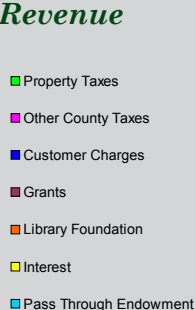

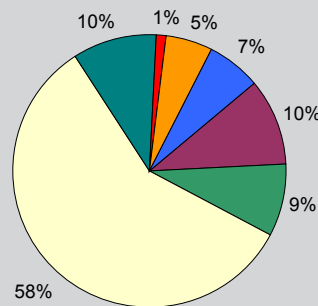
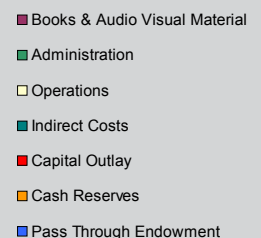
CCLS receives the majority of its money through property tax.
